# High Level Summary of Changes for the Division of AIDS (DAIDS) Table for Grading the Severity of Adult and Pediatric Adverse Events, Version 2.0

The Division of AIDS (DAIDS) Table for Grading the Severity of Adult and Pediatric Adverse Events, Version 2.0 contains a number of changes detailed below when compared with the Division of AIDS Table for Grading the Severity of Adult and Pediatric Adverse Events, Version 1.0 – December 2004 (Clarification dated August 2009). In addition, an introduction has been added, and the Glossary and Acronym and Instructions for Use sections have been expanded.

## Parameter (i.e., Adverse Event) Groupings Created

- Amylase-related laboratory values (i.e., Pancreatic and Total)
- Blood pressure abnormalities (i.e., Hypertension and Hypotension)
- Lipid disorders (i.e., Fasting Cholesterol, LDL, and Triglycerides)
- Seizures (i.e., New Onset Seizure and Pre-existing Seizure)

#### **Parameters Modified**

- Abnormal Fat Accumulation changed to Lipohypertrophy
- Bone Mineral Loss changed to Osteoporosis
- Hemoglobin categorized by age and sex
- Injection Site Reactions categorized by age, erythema or redness, and induration or swelling
- Insomnia moved to the new section heading called Psychiatric Conditions
- Unintentional Weight Loss changed to Weight Loss
- Urinary Tract Obstruction moved to the new section heading called Urinary
- Uveitis moved to the new section heading called Sensory
- Visual Changes moved to the new section heading called Sensory
- Vertigo moved to the new section heading called Sensory
- WBC, decreased categorized by age
